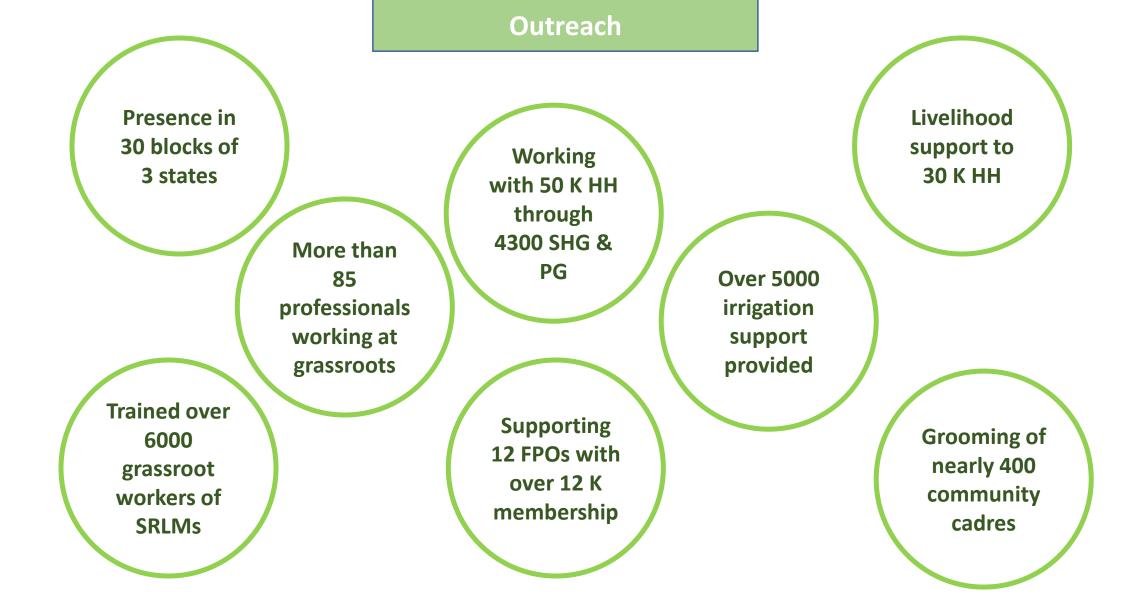

1.5 lakh small and marginal farming families have round the year food security, enhance annual income by INR 50000 per annum, and reduce risks related to credit, irrigation, and insurance.

Women Farmers' sense of social and political agency increases.



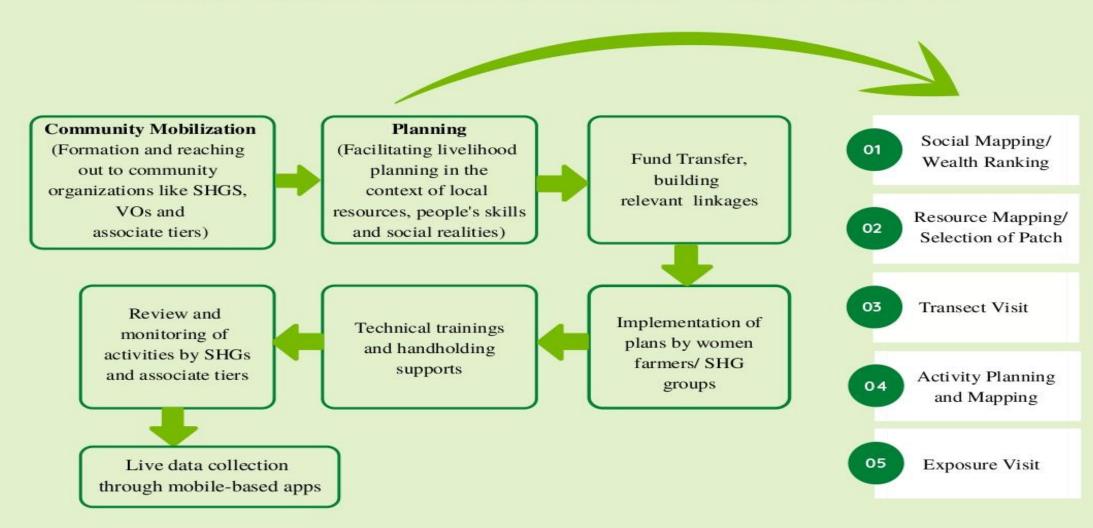
SeSTA's intervention model

Mobilize women to form strong village institutions at three tiers- hamlet, village and block Build social capital, along with savings and access to loans via Self Help Groups Provide each household with at least two sets of intervention – animal husbandry/ System of Rice Intensification/ horticulture/ System of Crop Intensification Help improve soil fertility, create irrigation infrastructure – for individual and community

IMPLEMENTATION PROCESS



SeSTA's Exit Plan from a Geography

Deploys a block level team to reach out to target population to carry out Value Chain Studies, Participatory Rural Appraisal exercise, Baseline Studies. The team has a senior person and a freshly trained executive.

YEAR 1-2

Household level livelihood planning done; interventions executed based on resource availability and future visioning; provides technical support, resource investment and allied services to the households. Continue to work with Farmer Producer Organizations with strong focus on outcomes and targets. Prepare for exit or further support if required.

YEAR 5

Identifies and trains community cadres, builds their knowledge, vision and creates a pool of Community Resource Persons (CRPs) (Agriculture and Animal Husbandry facilitators).
